

OAA Sept. 9th Minutes

Meeting called to order by President Julie MacKay at 1:15 p.m. 17 members were present. No secretary's report was given. Treasurer reported a balance of \$1526.91. A request was made to have a written itemizing of expenses. No cafe report was given. A motion was made for the cafe to receive written monthly invoices for expenses.

OLD BUSINESS:

Lance Little reported that Kroger donated 500 plates and 1000 napkins for the Sept. 16th Fly-In. Secretary will write a thank you note to Kroger manager.

OAA will host a potluck on Saturday, Sept. 15th at 6:00 p.m. OAA will provide table service and drinks. Participants are to bring a passing dish. There will be a campfire and possibly homemade ice cream. It will be in the grass area in front of Mid-State's hangar.

Workers will meet for breakfast at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 15th and set up tables and chairs at 10:00 a.m. in Mid-State's hangar.

On Sunday, Sept. 16th workers are to report at 6:30 a.m. to prepare food for breakfast. Fly-In breakfast will run from 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

Airport manager, Tim Harwood, reported that Young Eagles airplane rides will be given at the Fly-In. Pilots are to report at 8:30 a.m. for briefing at the terminal. Pilots giving rides will be offered a free breakfast. Tim requested a need for volunteers. Rides will be given out of terminal area. A helicopter may also be available.

General aviation pilots arriving for Fly-In will park in the grass area.

Craft show participants will be in the grass area in front of Mid-State's hangar.

Jim, Lance, and Stephanie will help park planes. Connie, Pat, Ken, and Tara will be in charge of food. Tim and Greg will help with car parking. Judy and Sheila will sell tickets. The Murphys will oversee parked planes.

OAA will need to order an additional porta-potty for the Fly-In.

Two lamps made from runway lights will be raffled off at the Fly-In. Participants will purchase a playing card for \$5.00. Will try to sell some at the cafe on Saturday.

NEW BUSINESS:

Irene offered to sew a new wind sock for the airport.

The Compass Rose will be painted by the 99's on October 13th. Sheila reported a need for plastic gallon jugs, 3" brushes, paint rollers with medium nap, 2" rolls of blue masking tape, and a large canvas to set paint materials on. Rain date will be next summer.

Concerning the rental of OAA tables and chairs, Lance and Shelia motioned to have rental prices set at \$5.00 per table, \$1.00 per chair with a maximum of \$40.00. Funds generated will be used to purchase new tables and chairs. Rita will have a sign-up sheet at the cafe and will oversee checking in and out of tables and chairs.

Julie is to attend a Curwood Festival meeting to look into having a Fly-In breakfast the Sunday of Curwood week for 2009.

Gordan Harrington, a visitor at the meeting, offered to help with advertising, sign designs, or marketing strategies for OAA.
